UPDATE – SENATE SET FOR MONDAY VOTE ON STIMULUS BILL

SATURDAY, FEBRUARY 7, 2009 – 10:55 A.M.

Senate Democrats reached a compromise with a bipartisan group of Senators last night that should allow a vote on the economic stimulus bill (S. 1) on Monday.

The deal in a nutshell: three Republican Senators (Susan Collins and Olympia Snowe from Maine, and Arlen Specter of Pennsylvania) have come on board in exchange for \$108 billion in cost reductions.

Last night, Majority Leader Harry Reid (D-NV) gained unanimous consent of the Senate to shut off the amendment process. Under the agreement (reprinted below), no further amendments are in order, save a new substitute for the entire bill to be filed today. That substitute will consist of the text of the original Inouye-Baucus substitute for H.R. 1 (S. Amdt. #98) with the \$108 billion in Nelson-Collins changes and incorporating all other amendments adopted as of last night.

A cloture vote on the new substitute will be held at 5:30 p.m. on Monday. Under the agreement, if cloture is agreed to (and if all Democratic Senators are present and vote yes, then the three Republican votes make the 60 votes for cloture a certainty), then a final vote on the substitute amendment, or a vote on a Budget Act waiver for the amendment (either one requiring no less than 60 affirmative votes) and a vote on final passage of H.R. 1 (requiring a simple majority) will occur starting at noon on Tuesday.

The agreement is mixed news for transportation and

infrastructure. Earlier iterations of the Nelson-Collins package cut funding for the \$5.5 billion discretionary surface transportation grant program in the Senate bill – an early version eliminated the program altogether, and a later version cut the program in half. But the final version of the Nelson-Collins amendment (see attached PDF file) contains no cuts at all in transportation or infrastructure spending except for a \$200 million reduction in aviation security procurement and a \$122.5 million cut in Coast Guard procurement.

However, shutting down the amendment process also means that none of the amendments increasing transportation or infrastructure funding will be allowed, either. Sen. Patty Murray (D-WA) yesterday withdrew her amendment that would have added an additional \$25 billion in infrastructure spending.

Other amendments are still theoretically possible, but only by the unanimous consent of all 100 Senators, which will be difficult to achieve.

Two amendments relevant to transportation were adopted yesterday before the amendment process was shut down. Both amendments were offered by Sen. Tom Coburn (R-OK). One amendment (#309) prohibits any funding under the bill from being used for a variety of purposes deemed wasteful by Coburn, including highway beautification projects. That amendment was agreed to by a 73-24 vote. The other amendment (#176) requires all contracts and grants under the act to be competitively bid. That amendment was adopted by a 97-0 vote.

The text of the Reid unanimous consent agreement is below, and a list of all spending cuts under the Nelson-Collins amendment is attached.

Mr. REID. Mr. President, I ask unanimous consent that no further amendments or motions be in order for the duration of the consideration of H.R. 1; and that on Saturday, February 7, the time from 12 noon to 3 p.m. be equally divided and controlled between the leaders or their designees; that there be debate only with no amendments or motions in order; provided further that when the Senate reconvenes on Monday, February 9, the time from 1 p.m. to 5:30 p.m. be divided and controlled in the same manner and that at 5:30 p.m., the Senate proceed to vote on the motion to invoke cloture on the Reid for Collins and Nelson of Nebraska, among others, amendment; that if cloture is invoked on the amendment, then postcloture time run during any recess or adjournment of the Senate on Monday; and that all postcloture time be considered expired at 12 noon on Tuesday; that on Tuesday, February 10, after the Senate reconvenes, the time until 12 noon be equally divided and controlled as provided above; and that if a budget point of order is made against the amendment, then a motion to waive the applicable point of order be considered made; that if the waiver is successful, the amendment be agreed to, and the motion to reconsider be laid upon the table; that if there is no point of order against the amendment, then adoption of the amendment be subject to a 60-vote threshold; the bill, as amended, be read a third time, and the Senate then proceed to a vote on passage of the bill; that upon passage, the Senate insist on its amendment, request a conference with the House on the disagreeing votes of the two Houses, and the Chair be authorized to appoint conferees, with the ratio agreed upon by the leaders, with the above all without further intervening action or debate.
