The FY 2016 Request assumed that Congress will enact an authorization law converting existing discretionary accounts for TIGER grants, Amtrak, high-speed rail, NHTSA operations, and mass transit programs to mandatory spending from a trust fund (governed by obligation limitations). But the Appropriations Committees cannot write a bill making such appropriations and limitations unless such an authorization law is enacted first, and the FAST Act did not do so, so the budget totals have been adjusted here to show current discretionary accounts remaining discretionary.
