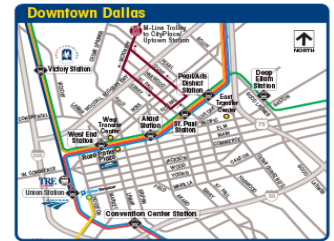

 - Get off at Victory Station
 - Catch the shuttle bus 934 Local
 - Get off at Akard Station
 - Continue walking across Akard on Pacific Ave. to the Hilton Garden Inn located at 1600 Pacific Ave, Dallas TX 75201
- From Love Field Airport (Weekends)**
 - Board the bus 524 (LoveLink) to Inwood/Love Field Rail Station
 - Board the Green/Orange Train to Buckner or LBJ/Central
 - Get off at Victory Station
 - Catch the shuttle bus 934 Local
 - Get off at Akard Station
 - Continue walking across Akard on Pacific Ave. to the Hilton Garden Inn located at 1600 Pacific Ave, Dallas TX 75201
