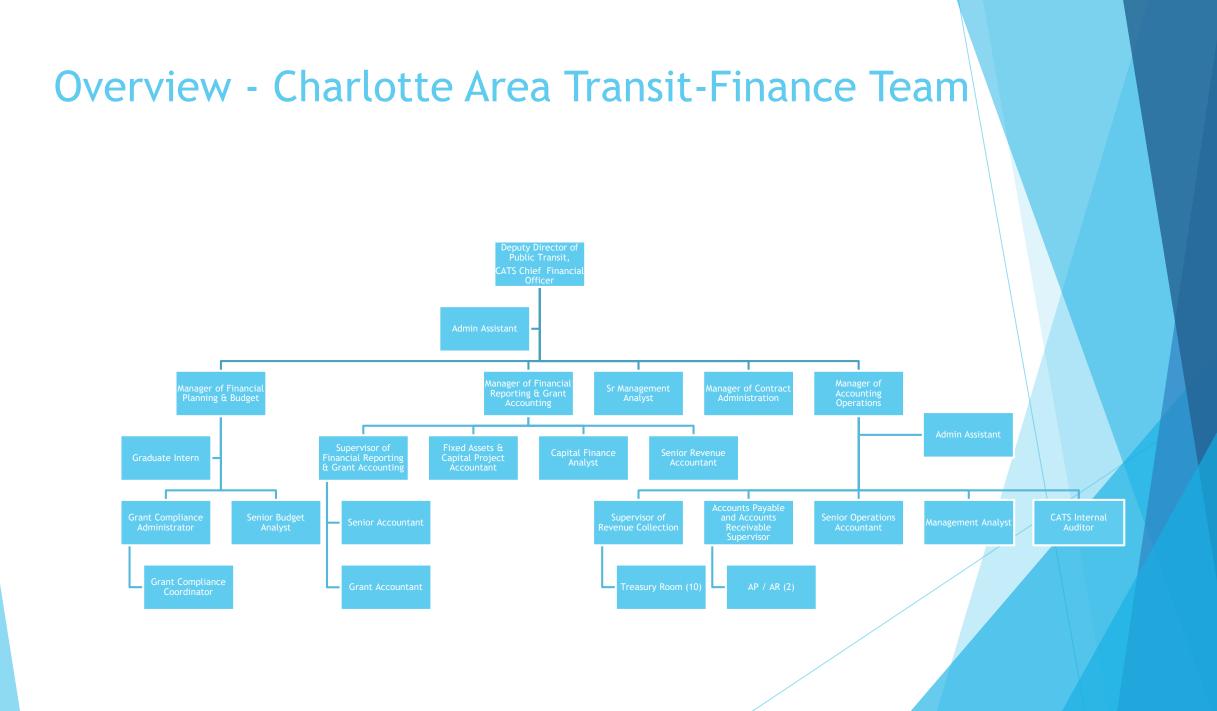

- Metropolitan Transit Commission (MTC) provides oversight and management of CATS
- Governed by MTC Financial Policies and City Policies

### **Overview -Charlotte Area Transit-Finance Tea**

Manage all financial aspects for CATS' transit administration, operations, maintenance, safety and security, project development, and capital projects including long-range financial planning, budget development, grant administration, debt financing, accounting operations, financial reporting, grant accounting, and revenue collections.

### **COVID -19 Timeline of Events**

March	March 10th, 2020 • NC Governor Roy Cooper declared a State of Emergency and Safer at Home Order
March	March 23rd, 2020 •CATS suspended fares for all services
March	March 27th, 2020 • Statewide stay at home order issued until April 29. • Coronavirus Aid, Relief, and Economic Security (CARES) signed into law
April	April 2nd,2020 • FTA announced \$63,620,890 in CARES funding for CATS
June	June 8th, 2020

### **COVID-19 Timeline of Events**

December	Dec 27th, 2020  • Coronavirus Response and Relief Supplemental Appropriations ACT (CRRSAA) signed into law
January	January 11th, 2021 • FTA announced \$52,345,661 in 5307 funds and \$166,938 5310 funds available through CRRSAA for CATS
January	January 31st, 2021 •CDC announced a federal mask requirement for transit systems following the Presidents Executive Order on January 21 <sup>st</sup> , 2021
March	March 11th, 2021 •American Rescue Plan (ARP) singed into Law

May	May 14th, 2021 • NC Governor lifted COVID-19 restrictions, lifting mask mandate for vaccinated individuals

✓ 2% increase from FY2021 Amended Budget to FY2022 Adopted Budget based on current trends

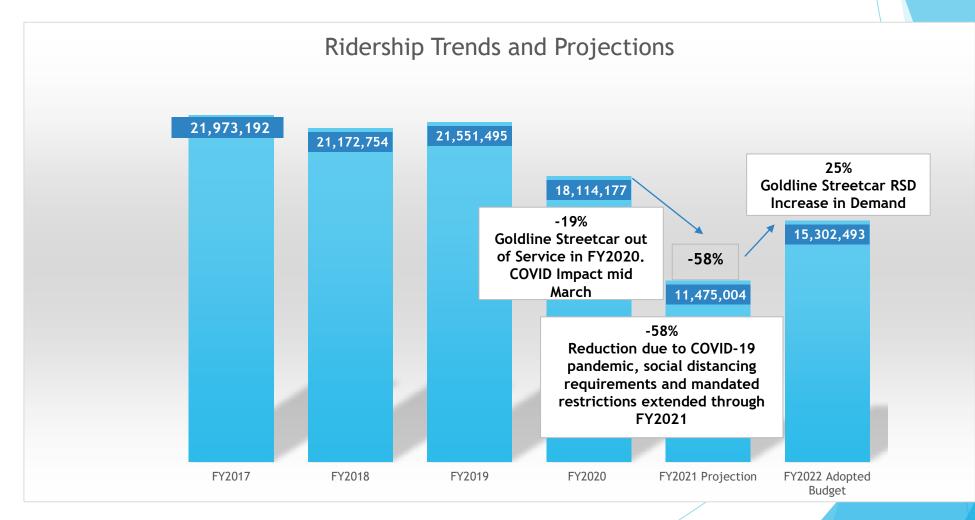
#### Increase in Fare Revenue

  - ✓ Full Year of Goldline Phase II paid service

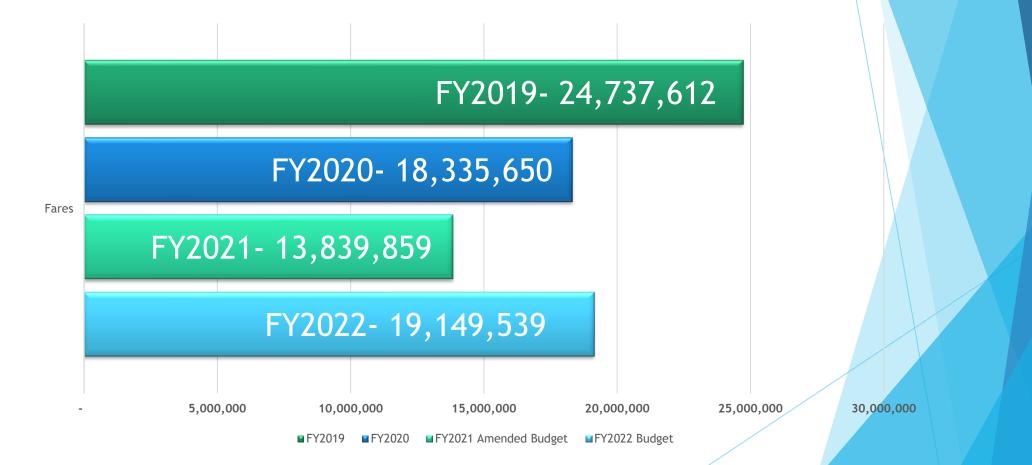
#### Decrease in Operating Assistance

  - Reduction in CARES funding allocated to Operating Expenses and Revenue Shortfalls
  - $\checkmark\,$  Elimination of Federal CMAQ funding for BLE

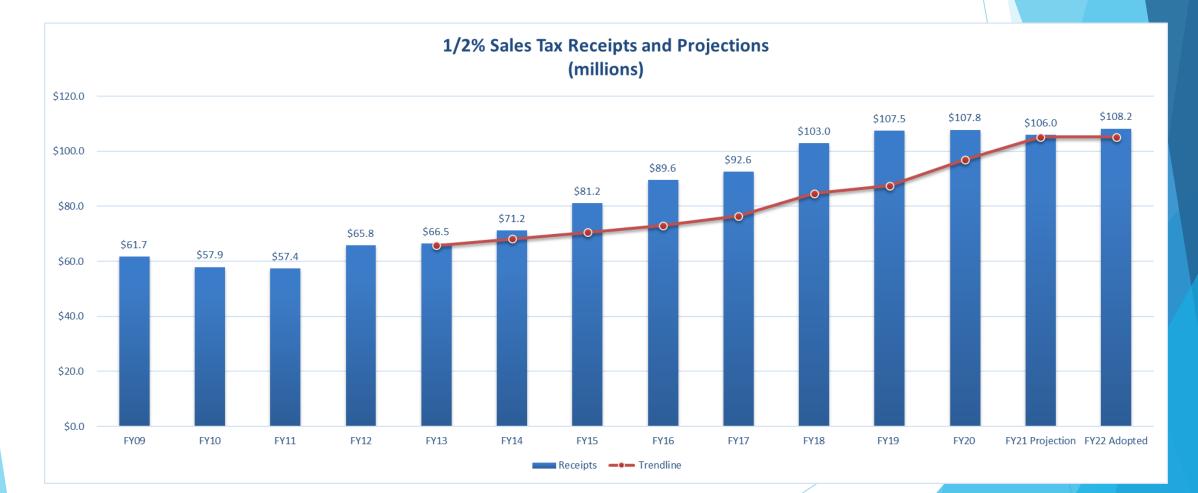
### Where We Are - Ridership

### Where We Are - Federal Assistance

#### > Provide funds for operating and capital expenses

- ➢ Items eligible under Sections 5307 and 5310
- Cost incurred to prevent, prepare for, and in response to the coronavirus public health emergency, as follows:
  - ✓ Operating Costs to maintain transit services
  - ✓ Revenue Shortfalls due to COVID 19
  - ✓ Purchase of Personal Protective Equipment
  - ✓ Paying Administrative Leave due to Service Reduction
  - ✓ Paying Premium Pay for Front Line Workers
  - ✓ Payroll and Expenses of private providers
  - ✓ Capital Costs incurred in response to COVID 19

#### CATS' cost for current FTA funded Capital Projects not yet in Revenue Service:

- ✓ Supplant Local Match

 $\checkmark\,$  Electronic only approval routing to accommodate remote staff

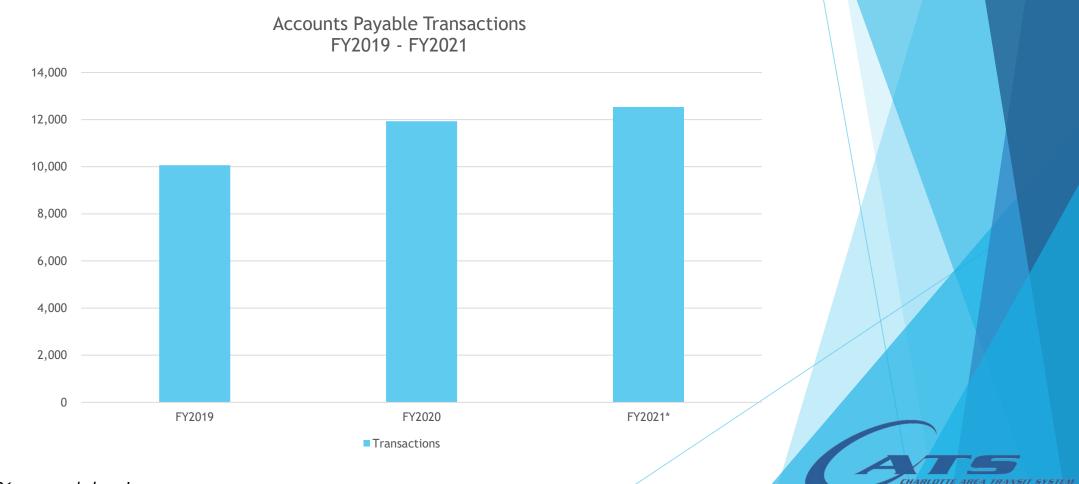
#### Reduction in On Site Staff
