Link light rail

- University of Washington, Capitol Hill, Downtown Seattle, Sea-Tac Airport, Angle Lake
- Tacoma Dome to Theater District

Sounder rail

- Everett to Seattle
- Lakewood/Tacoma to Seattle

ST Express bus

28 regional bus routes





Link light rail

- Gets you out of traffic: UW to Westlake in 6 minutes
- Every six minutes in peak hour
- 76,000 average weekday boardings





Sounder trains

- Service from Lakewood and Everett to Seattle
- Primarily during commute hours
- Special sports game-day trains
- Served over 18,000 daily riders in 2018





ST Express regional bus

- 28 routes
- 63,000 average weekday boardings



Sound Move

- 21 new Link light rail stations
- 82 miles of Sounder commuter rail
- 18 ST Express bus routes

2008 ST2

- 25 new Link stations
- More Sounder trips
- Sounder south stations parking and access
- Express bus expansion

2016 ST3

- 37 new Link stations
- Two new bus rapid transit corridors
- Sounder north stations parking and access improvements
- Sounder south track, signal and platform improvements for more service, longer trains



In the next five years...

Sound Transit is dramatically changing how we all get around the region.



Red Line extends to Northgate

- Opens 2021
- Underground stations at Roosevelt and U District
- Elevated station at Northgate
- Northgate to downtown Seattle: 13 minutes




The Blue Line opens 2023

- Connects Redmond to downtown Seattle, University of Washington and Northgate
- 10 new stations, 14 miles
- Bellevue to downtown Seattle: 23 minutes

Construction starts 2019 and 2020

For extensions opening 2024:

- Lynnwood Link: Shoreline, Mountlake Terrace and Lynnwood
- Federal Way Link: Kent/Des Moines, S 272nd and Federal Way
- Downtown Redmond: Marymoor Park and downtown Redmond

- Tacoma Dome Link
 Extension
- West Seattle and Ballard Link Extensions







Stride Bus Rapid Transit Begins running in 2024

- Serving north, east and south of Lake Washington
- Fast, frequent, reliable
- Connecting to Link light rail at Shoreline, Lynnwood, Bellevue, Tukwila





Sounder investments

- Sounder South: new garages at stations add more than 2000 parking spaces.
 - Expanded platforms, track and signal upgrades allow for more service.
 - Two new stations: Tillicum and DuPont.
- Parking and access improvements at Sounder North stations.







Link

- South Federal Way, Fife, East Tacoma, Tacoma Dome
- Alaska Junction, Avalon, Delridge



West Seattle Link Extension

- Opening 2030
- New stations at Delridge, Avalon and Alaska Junction; expanded stations at International District/Chinatown and SODO
- New rail-only fixed span crossing of the Duwamish River
- Length: 4.7 miles

- NE 130th St
- South Graham St
- South Boeing Access Rd







Link and new downtown tunnel

 Ballard, Interbay Smith Cove, Seattle Center, South Lake Union, Denny, Midtown



Ballard Link Extension

- Opening 2035
- Length: 5.4 miles
- Two tunnel stations: Seattle Center, South Lake Union
- Three elevated stations:
 Ballard, Interbay, Smith Cove
- New rail-only movable bridge over Salmon Bay



Where the money comes from


\$2.42 billion in revenues for 2019

Connecting to stations






Transit Oriented Development
