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



- 80+ stations, 400+ fully electric bike fleet
- ROAM operates and shares ownership with City of Omaha

Bike Share

- Operates in 4 cities, 5 counties, 2 states covers 125 sq. miles
- 85,000+ trips in 2023

LINCOLN, NE

B)ikeLNK

- 21 stations, 125 electric/classic bike fleet
- City of Lincoln owns, with ROAM as operating partner
- Current footprint prioritizes
 and downtown and UNL campus
 locations
 - 34,000+ trips in 2023

VALENTINE, NE

Valentine Bike Share

- 1 station, 8 classic bike fleet opened seasonally
- ROAM owns & operates
- North America's Most Rural Bike Share Station
- 400+ trips in 2023






Valentine Bike Share

- Launched in 2020
- North America's Most Rural Bike Share Station
- Located on the Cowboy Trail, a mile from the Niobrara overlook Borman Bridge
- Brings new communities to bike share
- Cowboy Trail is part of Nebraska Game & Parks







- Launched in 2018
- City of Lincoln owns the equipment, ROAM operates
- City of Lincoln keeps all system generated revenue and sponsorship revenue
- City of Lincoln pays ROAM ~\$300k annually
- Footprint over downtown and University of Nebraska campuses




Heartland 88 Bike Share

- Launched in 2011, relaunched as all electric in 2023
- HBS owns half the equipment, City of Omaha owns half **
- HBS keeps all system generated revenue & sponsorship revenue
- Multiyear ordinance with City of Omaha
- Large footprint that operates in two states and multiple cities & counties







